Accordingly, the Department of Law's statutorily required response to your Wednesday, May 4, 2022 3:19 PM request is due today, Monday, May 9, 2022. Please accept this response sent on Monday, May 9, 2022 as the Department of Law's statutorily required response to your Wednesday.

In your Wednesday, May 4, 2022 3:19 PM request, contained in the email chain below, you asked for the following. The City of Atlanta Department of Law's responses to your individual requests are below in Red.

1. Digital copies of any permits, leases, or any other agreements the City of Atlanta holds with the Midtown Music Festival entity or organizers.

The City of Atlanta is not currently in receipt of an application for a permit for an outdoor event filed by the organizers of Music Midtown for 2022. Accordingly, the City of Atlanta is not the custodian of any records responsive to your request. Nevertheless, attached hereto are the application, site plans, approved security plan and executed application for the event which occurred in September, 2021. These records are provided to you at no cost.

2. Digital copies of any email communications between any City Official or Department and the Midtown Music Festival entity or organizers with regard to their screening or weapons policy.



Dear City Attorney et al.,
The website for the Midtown Music Festival states the following:
"By purchasing a ticket you agree to submit to a full body pat-down before entry. If you would like to be

screened by security personnel of your same gender, please let security personnel know prior to the search process. Screening of children will always take place with the consent of a parent or guardian.

All bags will be searched before entry.

Persons that refuse to comply with the search policy will be refused entry into the event." (emphasis mine)

The website additionally states that weapons of any kind are prohibited.

There are a couple of problems with this. First of all, I do NOT agree that purchasing a ticket is a surrender of my 2nd and 4th Amendment Rights. And I would highly object to being groped by privately hired security.

The second problem is that lawfully carried weapons CANNOT be banned in public parks UNLESS a lessee of the park holds a lease which confers an estate for years (Georgia Supreme Court case Georgia Carry and Phillip Evans v. Atlanta Botanical Garden), and I can assure you that no private entity is leasing the general public area of Piedmont Park with this type of lease.

If the Atlanta Police Department will in any way participate in or enforce the pat-down and weapons policy of the Festival organizers, that would be an unlawful abuse of citizens' rights under color of law, and such a violation would not be covered under the qualified immunity doctrine.

Because the Festival organizers have publicly stated their intent to screen for and ban weapons contrary to state law, I'm demanding that you revoke their permit to hold the event unless they agree to follow state law and rescind this policy.

In addition, let this email be an OFFICIAL OPEN RECORDS REQUEST for the following:
